

Watch for the Light Reflection

In March of this year, I lost one of the brightest sources of light in my life--choral music. As the world shut down for the pandemic, stories quickly emerged of super-spreader events connected to choirs: a rehearsal in Washington where 87% of the singers were infected by a single asymptomatic person, similar events in Germany and Spain. It became clear that singing in a choir--usually a source of joy and beauty--was now a dangerous activity.

This was devastating news to me. As a high school choir director, my typical day involves directing three or four choir rehearsals and teaching voice lessons. I fill my time outside of school by directing and singing with even more choirs. If I take choirs and singing out of my professional life, there isn't much left! Choral music is not only my profession, but a true source of light in my life. Mark Twain said, "Find a job you enjoy doing, and you will never have to work a day in your life." Well, I am one of the lucky ones. I found it! Taking away music making from my daily life made the light feel very dim.

However I realized that the light hadn't gone out completely. Through the late spring and over the summer, I found new ways to make choral music. Rehearsing can happen through Zoom (as long as all of the singers mute themselves). Performances can be recorded individually and compiled to create a virtual performance. I have gained a new set of skills, learning audio and video software to make these performances possible. We are able to sing in school as long as students are 12 feet apart and wearing masks. It's a severe restriction, but at least we can sing! These new ways of making music pale in comparison to the brilliant light of singing in large groups together. We can't hear each other. Singers can't lean on each other for help with the music. We can't experience the wonderful feeling of singing a chord perfectly in tune.

But...we still sing together. We sing separately, but our voices are unified in song. As I add each voice to the mix of a new choir anthem, I am reminded that choral music allows us to be a part of something bigger than ourselves. The whole is greater than the sum of its parts. Our choir is built voice-by-voice until it becomes a unified, beautiful, joyous light. We may not experience that light as often as usual. We may not experience it in the same time and place. But we keep the light alive and glowing.
