

We are currently in the midst of the worst global pandemic in the last 100 years, with deaths in the U.S. rapidly approaching a mind-boggling 300,000! Medical experts tell us that the coming winter will be a long and dark one, as those numbers continue to rise. It is impossible to ignore the devastation of COVID19.

Efforts to prevent the spread have affected people's jobs and where they work, the way kids play and go to school, and the ability to gather in person with family and friends. These measures have also changed how people shop, worship, exercise, eat, seek entertainment, and celebrate holidays and special events.

It is natural to mourn all we have lost: human touch; face-to-face interactions with family, friends, and colleagues; our daily routine; jobs; financial and economic stability; sense of safety, predictability, control, freedom, and security. The pandemic has unraveled our lives in ways we thought unimaginable just a year ago.

In the midst of all of this darkness where do we see the light of Christ? We see it in the physically and emotionally exhausted medical community who continue to work incredibly long hours under challenging conditions to treat the ill and to comfort the dying with quiet words and gentle touch so they do not die alone; their stories bring us to tears. In the dedication of teachers as they learn new technology to reach and stimulate students through distance learning. In those who check in on family, friends, and neighbors, especially the elderly. In the faithful leadership of pastors who must rethink how to provide worship opportunities and points of connection for congregations unable to gather in person. In those who shop and run errands for parents and grandparents. In grocery workers, first responders, childcare providers, electricians and plumbers, maintenance and transportation workers, and all those who supply the goods and services on which we depend.

The following quote from Mike Slaughter in his book *Christmas Is Not Your Birthday* is especially timely. "Even in the midst of the unexpected, the messy, and the devastating, you can still fully expect God to show up. No matter what you are struggling to overcome, God promises to show up. This is truly what Christmas is about: in the midst of all our messes – poverty, genocide, environmental disasters, wars, terrorism, religious hate and bigotry, divorce, illness, and yes, even death – God shows up to bring you peace, purpose, joy, hope, and wholeness."

Nothing will be impossible with God! Watching for the light means living with hopeful expectation for God's promise to be fulfilled. Watch for the Light this Advent. We invite you to participate in our weekly livestream from your home and light Advent candles, sing carols, and listen to familiar stories that help us prepare for the birth of Christ, who brings hope and promise, even when we are separated (details about our livestream worship are listed below). # Live Our Faith in Daily Life

- ★ Our theme, *Watch for the Light*, struck me when I read an article about the Star of Bethlehem. Did you know that the Star of Bethlehem will be visible in the sky this year around Christmastime? Yes, you heard me right. The Star of Bethlehem ... the same one that the Magi followed to see Jesus. Mark your calendar. The Christmas Star will appear shortly after dusk on December 21st. This is a once-in-a-lifetime experience. In fact the last time this occurred was back in the Middle Ages, in the year 1228, nearly 800 years ago. The Star of Bethlehem is actually two planets, Jupiter and Saturn, whose orbits will be lined up so they look like a huge bright star in the sky. It's interesting in the bible story, the Magi followed the star. But how could they "follow" a star? We know that stars are bright but they don't move... Astronomers say that the Star of Bethlehem was not a star at all, but planets. From our vantage point here on earth they looked like a single bright star in the sky when their orbits line up as they did when Jesus was born. Check it out. *Watch for the Light* on December 21st.

Look in the southwestern sky, just above the horizon and you might see the Star of Bethlehem that led the Wise Men to Jesus.

• Who is or is not represented in places of power?

(Why is a female, person of color as Vice President so unusual?)

Who is or is not represented in the positive and negative history of the culture?
 (What were we taught in school about the Trail of Tears, the Tulsa Greenwood Massacre, women and/or people of color scientists, mathematicians, or engineers?)

Some definitions to help you think about those questions:

**BIPOC** – Black, Indigenous, People of Color

**Gender** – the cultural or self-selected identification of a person along a spectrum of male or female characteristics

**LGBTQ** – Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgendered, Queer (or questioning)

**Disability** – Any condition which makes it more difficult for a person to engage or interact with the world around them
