

The 30 Hour Famine is an event our youth take part in each year. Not only do our youth learn about world hunger, serve others, and grow closer to God through this experience, they get a small glimpse into what physical hunger feels like. This unique opportunity creates an environment where youth genuinely connect to the experience on many levels. But why is it so important we participate in this event?

According to the ELCA World Hunger website, more than 820 million people (about 11% of people in the world) are hungry. 736 million (10% of the world's population) people live in extreme poverty on less than \$1.90 per day. In 2017, more than 40 million Americans were unsure where their next meal might come from. In a world where some have so much, too many have barely enough to get by. Taking time to learn, serve, give, and experience is crucial in the fight against world hunger.

This year BLC is giving the funds we raise through the 30 Hour Famine to ELCA's World Hunger. This ministry not only supports food pantries and soup kitchens around the world, but also provides health clinics, microloans, and advocacy for different communities. In 2017, ELCA World Hunger donations totaled to over \$21.3 million to help others. This ministry has projects in 43 U.S. states and territories as well as 62 countries all over the world.





David Gerhardt will lead this study using the book, Love Is The Way, Holding On To Hope In Troubling Times, by Bishop Michael Curry, who is the Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church. Much of the world met Bishop Curry when he delivered his sermon on the redemptive power of love at the royal wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle at Windsor Castle. In Love Is The Way, Bishop Curry shares a message of hope as we follow the way of Jesus, living a life of love and grace towards others. The way of love is essential for addressing the seemingly insurmountable challenges facing our world today: poverty, racism, selfishness, deep ideological divisions. Only love has the power to move us forward to reconciliation, healing and renewal. Such love comes from God and God empowers us to then live this way of love. This 6-week class will take place through Zoom on Sundays (February 14, 21, 28 and March 14, 21, 28). The often-used image for Lent is that of a wilderness; just as Jesus wandered for forty days in his own wilderness. How did we walk? Who helped us walk? What unexpected things did we find? Where did we see the light? What does our future look like after we come through it?

Please begin your reflection with a simple phrase from Scripture, a poem or a song, if you make your reflection a drawing (black and white only, please!) use the Scripture as a caption. Please also close with a simple one-line prayer. The format is: Title, quote or scripture, the body of your reflection, and the one-line prayer.
