

This year for Lent, we will live out our community connections in a bigger way, by joining together with congregations across the Genesee Finger Lakes Conference over Zoom for a midweek Lenten series.

Drawing from the Sunday texts and stories from Mark's Gospel, we will reflect together on the various ways we are called to be community: with creation, with the saints, with our neighbor, with those on the margins, and with Christ. Each **Wednesday at 7 pm**, we will join in worship together around a different theme, led by pastors across the conference in a simple liturgy of word and prayer. At 7:30, those who wish, may continue with an option to grow deeper in community, either through conversation around the day's text, or through learning a new prayer practice that expands upon the week's theme.



Due to overwhelming interest, a second sign up has been created to allow a second family or individual to *also* provide 20 items a week. Each Hunger Activist will collect 20 or more of the designated weekly items. You can purchase, ask for donations, or use other legal, creative methods for obtaining the items. Deliver the items anytime during your week to the mini-food pantry.

Preparing for a Return to In-Person Worship

In the past year, there have been a lot of changes throughout the world, our country and even here at BLC. We went from an in-person only church to going virtual for almost everything in a very short time. With the hope that the vaccine brings and the lower levels of Covid-19, the re-opening committee is working diligently for how and when BLC will be able to provide more opportunities for in-person worship. We don't yet have a date, but we are working toward that reality. As we envision how to accommodate both in-person and virtual worshippers, we want to ensure that BLC members and friends have similar experiences whether we are seated in a pew or in our homes. The goal is to allow everyone who wishes to participate in worship an opportunity to do so. BLC has been researching ways to leverage technology to make this a reality. So changes are coming! BLC will be starting the use of video displays in the sanctuary when we reopen. The video displays will allow worship to include some of the things we have been able to include over the last year: guest speakers, videos of our choirs, and other appropriate items. The re-opening committee is working closely with the facility team and Pastor Amy to make sure that these changes are made in ways that enhance, and do not detract, from Bethlehem's worship life. It may take us some time to get this right. We invite your patience and your comments as we work on this change.

Music Staff information: Susan DePasquale has been an integral part of BLC the family for 32 years through her gift of music. After all these years, Susie has shared that she plans to retire at the end of August, 2021. The good news for us is that Susie will not be leaving Bethlehem, she will remain an active member of this congregation. Susie shared with Council that the events of the past year have not been a factor in her decision. This had been her plan before the year 2020 came with all its trials and before knowing that in 2021 we would be celebrating our 100th anniversary at Bethlehem.

In addition, Annette Finkbeiner has shared her intention to end her service as Director of the Chancel Bells and Children's Choirs in May at the end of the current program year.

Our pastors will begin to work with the Personnel Committee and our existing music staff to develop plans and appropriate candidates to bring to the Council. The Council will begin to work to identify opportunities to recognize and give thanks to Annette and Susie for their years of faithful musical leadership.
