

Every now and then you read or hear an idea, which completely reshapes your perception of a topic. *Caste* will challenge your beliefs and assumptions about the origins of the racial divide in America. The author's perspective will make so much sense you will wonder why more people are not talking about it. Isabel Wilkerson looks at the difference between caste and class in both the United States and India, comparing the development of a privileged hierarchy within a culture, and efforts to maintain or raise a group's place within that hierarchy. A recommended read for all Christians who want to understand how the U.S. got to such a place of inequality and especially for those who do not believe there is racial tension in the United States.
