I lift up my eyes to the hills – from where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth... - Psalm 121

I love the book of Psalms. Partially because I love poetry; partially because all ranges of emotions are so eloquently expressed. So, this is where I turn when I reach for the Bible. Psalm 121 has always been my favorite. I guess growing up in the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia had much to do with that. Whenever I was overwhelmed, fearful or alone, all I had to do was look upward at the Blue Ridge Mountains and feel the reassurance that the Lord would protect me. It was as if a protective warm blanket covered me and I knew not be afraid. Even though those mountains are far, far away in distance and time, I still recite this psalm (although the old King James version is my favorite) when I need comfort. I have always received it. I have faced difficulties in my life, like most of us, but I knew that the warm, comforting blanket of the Lord was always wrapped around me to help me through the dark and difficult times.

This is what comforts me through this pandemic. Sure, there have been inconveniences and sadness over missed gatherings, missed hugs and the isolation from others but I am blessed to be retired, I have plenty of food, I have a warm house and I have love from family and friends. I have so many blessings as God truly walks with me and gives me strength.

Wednesdays in Lent - Created for Community at 7 pm on Zoom

This year for Lent, we will live out our community connections in a bigger way, by joining together with congregations across the Genesee Finger Lakes Conference over Zoom for a midweek Lenten series.

Drawing from the Sunday texts and stories from Mark's Gospel, we will reflect together on the various ways we are called to be community: with creation, with the saints, with our neighbor, with those on the margins, and with Christ. Each **Wednesday at 7 pm**, we will join in worship together around a different theme, led by pastors across the conference in a simple liturgy of word and prayer. At 7:30, those who wish, may continue with an option to grow deeper in community, either through conversation around the day's text, or through learning a new prayer practice that expands upon the week's theme.

In addition, each congregation will also participate in a shared commitment to address hunger relief or food insecurity in their local community. Look for opportunities to be a Hunger Activist at Bethlehem this Lent.

Due to overwhelming interest, a second sign up has been created to allow a second family or individual to also provide 20 items a week. Double the impact! Sign up at the link to be the SECOND Hunger Activist for a week.

M&SC: Hunger Activists 2 (signupgenius.com). Be sure to scroll all the way to the bottom of the sign-up page to complete your reservation. There are still opportunities available for you in March through May.

Each Hunger Activist will collect 20 or more of the designated weekly items. You can purchase, ask for donations, or use other legal, creative methods for obtaining the items. Deliver the items anytime during your week to the mini-food pantry. To find the cupboard: Enter by either Pines of Perinton entrance (Rt 250 or Whitney Rd) and stay on the road that loops around the apartments. Look for the outside BLUE wood and chicken wire mini cupboard by the maintenance shed. It is open 24/7. Take a picture of yourself by the cupboard and post it on the BLC family. Or check out photos posted by your BLC family.

You can contribute by doing a contactless delivery of items to the homes of those who have signed up (you may want to email or call first). Think of it as a reverse scavenger hunt!
