

I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit. John 15.5

I happen to live with a vine scientist and I asked Hans recently to help me understand the science of how vines produce fruit.

Optimal conditions of soil nutrition, water, and sun lead to abundant fruit. That's not a surprise to anyone who's spent much time in a garden. Here's what surprised me - a vine's yield (it's fruitfulness) has as much to do with what happened in the vineyard in the previous year as what is happening this year. Past stress to the vine requires time to heal so that the vine's fruit-bearing can be optimized. I suspect this is not just true of vines.

Since Easter, we've gathered together and listened to nearly 90 individuals (representing 59 households) in our Bethlehem vineyard (as well as those who shared through email or calls). The willingness to come together in all manner of cold, rainy, and windy weather (and one day of sun!) shows the strength of connection we have to Christ, our vine, as well as a deep desire to be in community with one another! We started these sessions by asking people to share the high and low points of the last year for them or their households. As we listened in community, we began to hear some of the stressors our various branches have experienced this past year – separation from family and community connections, juggling continual change, struggles to balance multiple demands for time, as well as struggles to find ways to fill time, removal from comforting and familiar rituals, suspension of meaningful opportunities to serve and contribute. These stressors will continue to impact our fruitfulness as a community of faith, even as we move to increase opportunities for connection in the weeks and months ahead.

All of this is a reminder that fruitfulness isn't something we do by force of will. Fruitfulness is a grace - the result of being firmly connected to Christ, our vine, who provides all that we need to produce abundant fruit. And that vine that sustains us, Jesus himself, knows that after times of stress and strain – like these last fourteen months – we will need our soil nurtured, our soul's watered, and lots of Son-light in order to heal and become fruitful again!

Maybe like me, you are aware of how hard it is to be fruitful after the year of stress and trauma many of us have lived through. I take comfort and great hope in remembering that our branches are forever part of Christ, the vine. He will supply all that we need to nourish, sustain, and heal us, until our branches are ready to bear fruit again. I'm also heartened that through Christ, our vine, we are connected through this community of faith where he will continue to tend our soil, water our souls, and allow the Son's light to heal us back into fruitfulness! Thanks be to God for Jesus, the vine!
