### **December 5 - Advent 2 - "Laying the Foundation" (Peace)**

Philippians 1:3-11 and Luke 1:57-80 We make space – in our lives and our imaginations – for God's blessings to break through.

# December 12 - Advent 3 - "A Home for All" (Joy)

Zephaniah 3:14-20 and Luke 3:1-18 John the Baptist's good news sounds harsh, but he preaches a home for all.

### December 19 - Advent 4 - "Seeking Sanctuary" (Love)

Luke 1:46b-55 (Magnificat) and Luke 1:39-55 *Sanctuary is anywhere God's love dwells freely and abundantly.* 

### December 24 - Christmas Eve – "Invited Home"

Luke 2:1-20 At 5:30pm, be part of re-telling the story of Christmas in our Pop-Up Christmas pageant! No rehearsal required! We are all part of sharing the good news this night in story and song! At 7:30pm, we'll sing carols, share communion, and welcome the good news of great joy for all people!

### December 26 – "Chosen Home"

Colossians 2:41-52 and Luke 2:41-52 Jesus claims and takes up space, choosing to dwell where God has chosen him to be.

# January 2 – Epiphany Lessons and Carols – "Home By Another Way"

*Through Scripture and song, remember the whole story of Christmas – from prophecies to shepherds to Magi. Sometimes, we too must make bold choices to choose a different way.*
