

This week's reflection comes from this year's Close to Home Advent Devotional. B&W copies are available in the Narthex. Electronic or color copies can be available through the church office.

**Read** Luke 1 39-55 **Commentary** by Elder Vilmarie Cintrón-Olivieri

When thinking about "sanctuary," the lyrics of a Carrie Newcomer song hit close to home...

"Will you be my refuge, my haven in the storm, Will you keep the embers warm when my fire's all but gone?

Will you remember, and bring me sprigs of rosemary, Be my sanctuary 'til I can carry on, carry on, carry on. . ."<sup>17</sup>

In the song, Newcomer lists places, experiences, and metaphors to define sanctuary: "rest here in Brown Chapel... with a circle of friends... a quiet grove of trees... between two bookends." We can imagine these as safe spaces, uplifting and welcoming. My own list would include grandma's kitchen, watercolor paints, and the arms of a loved one. What would your list include? If you close your eyes, can you picture yourself there? Wherever it is, a place where God's love dwells freely and abundantly is sanctuary.

Hearing the news of her pregnancy, Mary sought such a place. As a pregnant teenager, poor and unwed, dangers and uncertainty—both physical and societal—surrounded her. With haste, she journeys to Elizabeth's house. Elizabeth—and the child in her womb—welcome and affirm her. Mary then bursts into a song of praise: "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior" (v. 46-7).

For three months, that home and the arms that received Mary became her safe haven. Elizabeth's welcome, blessing, and care were safe space, just what she needed as she prepared for the important call ahead. Mary would give birth to Jesus and would educate him in his formative years. The world saw the imprint of this young woman in the life and teachings of her son, Jesus. Mary herself was sanctuary and Jesus' first home.

Sanctuary is not only a place. It is also the people who say, "Here I am," striving to create and to become a safe place for others. Will we be a refuge, someone's haven in the storm, sanctuary? In the spirit of these two holy women, Mary and Elizabeth, may we offer ourselves as sanctuary for anyone in need of one—glorifying, with our actions, the One whose love, freely given, is our sanctuary, our home.

# 100 YEARS



So grab a square and a prayer, add a message, or write your own prayer and give it to someone you know who may need some of God's comfort. **V** Save the date for the next Crucial Conversation (over Zoom)! Join us on Monday, January 24 and Monday, January 31 at 7 pm. In partnership with St. Luke's Episcopal Church, we are hosting a presentation and conversation on "Christian Nationalism: the Intersection of Religion and Politics". Our resource for the conversation includes a webinar on the subject that features Bishop Michael Curry (Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church) and Bishop Elizabeth Eaton (Presiding Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America). Our "crucial conversations" will begin with a presentation by The Very Rev. William H. Petersen, Emeritus Dean and Professor of Bexley Hall Seminary, resident of Fairport and member of St. Luke's Episcopal. As a theologian and historian, Rev. Petersen will provide a framework for engaging the conversation, understanding what is meant by the term "Christian nationalism" and why its emergence is problematic, and how it helps us understand recent events, including what happened at the capital on January 6, 2021. **Sharing Our Blessings Team:** As a result of a financial surplus in FY 2021, the BLC congregation voted at their October 31 Annual Meeting to distribute \$30,000 beyond the walls of Bethlehem. The Council charged an ad hoc committee, now known as the Sharing Our Blessings Team, to develop criteria, seek congregational input, and make recommendations to the Council for distributing funds. The team consisting of Cathy Gottermeier, Alli O'Malley, Julie Owen, Lisa Rosenbauer, Alan Sleeman (chair), and Pastor Amy have begun meeting and expect to make recommendations to Council on distribution criteria by the January Council meeting. Once affirmed, the team will seek input from the Bethlehem congregation to determine qualifying recipient(s). Amidst a period of great uncertainty, our congregation was blessed by our member's faithful stewardship. It is a privilege to share these gifts. We ask for your prayers and support in offering these blessings in Jesus' name. Please reach out to a member of the Sharing Blessings Team if you have any questions.

**The Re-Opening Team** met on December 7 to review our current protocols in light of the State of Emergency that was recently declared by the Monroe County Department of Health. Given the high rate of community spread, the team continues to affirm that our current protocols are appropriate for our present circumstances. At BLC, we continue to wear masks at all times when moving through the building, as well as on Sunday mornings in worship and during faith formation activities. We continue to avoid sharing food fellowship indoors.

Knowing the deep longing for opportunities to share conversation and build connections and relationships through food fellowship, the Re-Opening Team is committed to continuing to meet in the weeks following the Christmas season to monitor and adjust BLC's protocols, as warranted by circumstances in the wider community. As has been the case throughout the pandemic, we encourage people to stay at home if they are sick or are experiencing any Covid-related symptoms.

## **Community News**

**Lutheran Disaster Response - U.S. Tornadoes:** On the night of Dec. 10, a devastating outbreak of more than 30 tornadoes swept through six states. Kentucky was impacted the most, with more than 70 people reported dead. Homes and businesses were destroyed, including a candle factory in Mayfield, Ky., where first responders are still searching for survivors. More than 330,000 people are without electricity across multiple states. The full extent of the damage is expected to become clear in the coming days.

Lutheran Disaster Response is engaging with partners in the affected areas, including the Indiana-Kentucky Synod, to respond to immediate needs. Given the initial damage assessments, recovery will likely take years, and Lutheran Disaster Response is prepared to accompany survivors until the response is complete.

What you can do:

**Pray:** Please pray for the people who were impacted by the destructive tornadoes. May God's healing presence give them peace and hope in their time of need. Pray that God will deliver comfort to those who mourn the loss of loved ones and strength to those who are working diligently to care for affected communities.

**<u>Give:</u>** Gifts to "<u>U.S. tornadoes</u>" will be used entirely (100%) to assist those affected by tornadoes until the response is complete.
