

In-person Opportunities:

5:30 pm (in-person only), be part of re-telling the story of Christmas in our Pop-Up Christmas pageant! No rehearsal required! We are all part of sharing the good news this night in story and song!

7:30 pm (in-person or livestream), we'll sing carols, share communion, and welcome the good news of great joy for all people! Musical Prelude begins at 7:00 pm.

Prayer Squares are available in the narthex! So what is a Prayer Square? It's a knitted square that can function as a small version of a prayer shawl. Prayer squares give us an opportunity to bless others through a simple, personal encounter designed to leave a lasting impression of God's love. They provide prayers for the people that need the warmth of God. Placed in a pocket or backpack or purse, the prayer square serves as a reminder: that someone has already prayed for you, and also a reminder to pause and pray. Put it in your backpack, briefcase, purse, or car. When you need reassurance, pull it out and you will know that God is everywhere. So grab a square and a prayer, add a message, or write your own prayer and give it to someone you know who may need some of God's comfort. ♦ Save the date for the next Crucial Conversation (over Zoom)! Join us on Monday, January 24 and Monday, January 31 at 7 pm. In partnership with St. Luke's Episcopal Church, we are hosting a presentation and conversation on "Christian Nationalism: the Intersection of Religion and Politics". Our resource for the conversation includes a webinar on the subject that features Bishop Michael Curry (Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church) and Bishop Elizabeth Eaton (Presiding Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America). Our "crucial conversations" will begin with a presentation by The Very Rev. William H. Petersen, Emeritus Dean and Professor of Bexley Hall Seminary, resident of Fairport and member of St. Luke's Episcopal. As a theologian and historian, Rev. Petersen will provide a framework for engaging the conversation, understanding what is meant by the term "Christian nationalism" and why its emergence is problematic, and how it helps us understand recent events, including what happened at the capital on January 6, 2021. Community News

▶ Part time job opportunity shared by Jim Berner: I have been working work part time at URMC, the Flaum Eye Institute since about a week after I retired from the home care agency, in 2016. The eye institute is expanding all the time and bringing in top level researchers from across the world. Projects vary from renovation of existing and developed eye practice sites to preparing labs for the researchers. We are interested in another person to do more of the work that I am doing, as well as preparing to take my position over, in the next couple of years as I have been doing this for 5 years and am 70. I will be ready to back off or out in less than two years. It is something new all the time, the projects are manageable, with relationships developed with the facilities and construction teams at the med center. I am having fun at it, don't have to work, so if it was a drag, I wouldn't be doing it.

There are benefits at part time hours, or they can work as TAR, time as reported. No benefits. (the hours there are limited however) It is an ideal position for someone who might be in a similar spot as myself. Lutheran Disaster Response - U.S. Tornadoes: On the night of Dec. 10, a devastating outbreak of more than 30 tornadoes swept through six states. Kentucky was impacted the most, with more than 70 people reported dead. Homes and businesses were destroyed, including a candle factory in Mayfield, Ky., where first responders are still searching for survivors. More than 330,000 people are without electricity across multiple states. The full extent of the damage is expected to become clear in the coming days. Lutheran Disaster Response is engaging with partners in the affected areas, including the Indiana-Kentucky Synod, to respond to immediate needs. Given the initial damage assessments, recovery will likely take years, and Lutheran Disaster Response is prepared to accompany survivors until the response is complete.

What you can do:

Pray: Please pray for the people who were impacted by the destructive tornadoes. May God's healing presence give them peace and hope in their time of need. Pray that God will deliver comfort to those who mourn the loss of loved ones and strength to those who are working diligently to care for affected communities.

Give: Gifts to "U.S. tornadoes" will be used entirely (100%) to assist those affected until the response is complete.
