

I have a distinct memory of receiving my first communion in elementary school. I don't remember the communion meal itself, what I remember is the night before. For some reason I had missed the final preparation class and so I was working my way through a worksheet I had been given to help me prepare. I recall that my dad came to sit with me that Saturday evening and talk through the worksheet with me. I suspect he even shared with me what communion meant to him! I don't have any memory of what that worksheet asked or what the communion experience itself was like. What I remember was the deepening of relationship with my dad through a shared conversation about faith.

At Bethlehem, *Welcome to the Table*, is what we call preparation for communion. For some young people it happens after they've had their first communion and for others it comes before. In our preparation we try to share the fullness of God's love made visible in Jesus, who is fully present to us in the communion meal. In age-appropriate ways, we invite people into exploring Luther's teaching on the Sacrament of the Altar in the Small Catechism (Luther's name for Holy Communion, which is printed in the back of the Red Hymnal). We also invite children and their families into some of the communion preparations – this year they'll be making the bread for February 20 and helping to set the altar table.

Most of all though, we hope that Bethlehem's preparation for first communion strengthens and deepens relationships with Jesus and with parents or other important adults who share a child's faith. It's in these relationships with Jesus and with each other what we often come to understand the forgiveness and mercy that are offered to us in the Lord's Supper.

I invite you to join those preparing to be Welcomed to the Table at 10:15 am on February 13 in the Sanctuary or on Zoom. This is a chance for all of us to be reminded of what it means to receive Christ in bread and wine and to be nurtured through this meal for life in the world today!

Join us in worship also on February 20 when five young people are officially Welcomed to the Table where there's always a place for you as well!



## 100th Anniversary News

100 YEARS Our thanks to Rev. Matthew Nickoloff for leading us in worship at our February 6 anniversary service. Son of long-time members, Pastor Lori and Keith Nickoloff, and ordained at Bethlehem in 2012, he now serves as pastor of the South Wedge Mission in Rochester. Following worship, he shared more about his ministry in words and photos, and thanked all of us for our generosity in supporting SWM both financially and through helping with hands-on projects.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Keeping within the COVID guidelines, our February 12 Pot Luck Dinner has been postponed until spring. However, after worship on Sunday, February 20, you will have the opportunity to watch a 20-minute video, called the Highlight Reel. Compiled from interviews of 33 fellow members, as well as current and former pastors, it is a wonderful tribute to why we all love Bethlehem. Following

the video, Kathy Forney will read a poem outlining our history written by Ann Rasbeck. Do mark this date on your calendars and join us in the sanctuary. This event will be live streamed.

Following worship on Sunday, February 27, John Schmeelk, our BLC historian, will share a little more about the work of those faithful servants who laid the foundation for Bethlehem one hundred years ago. In 1921 our newly-formed congregation first met above Wagor Drug Store on North Main Street roughly opposite the current Village Hall. Later that year, on October 26, the congregation purchased property at our current location. Approval was granted to build a permanent church building on February 12, 1922 – one hundred years ago this month. Impressively, within thirteen months, the church was completed and on March 11, 1923 a dedication service for the building and its furnishings was held. John's presentation will also be live streamed.

Sadly, our scheduled March 20 guest pastor, Rev. Paul Adler (son of Rev. Dallas Adler, 1958-1966, and a former BLC member) is unable to join us in leading worship due to lingering effects from COVID. He will be sending a taped message which will be live streamed.

★ **Re-Opening Update** - As New York State's indoor mask mandate expires, Bethlehem will return to the guidance in place prior to its implementation.

- We wear masks on Sunday mornings, during faith-formation activities, and whenever moving through the building.
- Worship leaders who are speaking may remove their mask when in a leadership role (ex. preaching, reading, etc)
- Small groups meeting at church may determine whether or not masks will be worn during their meeting times.
- We continue to avoid sharing food fellowship indoors.

As always, we encourage people to stay at home if they are sick or are experiencing any Covid-related symptoms. The Re-Opening team will be meeting in the next two weeks to determine if other changes can be made at this time.

**Quarterly Dialogue Recap:** Last Sunday the BLC Council and Pastors held the first Quarterly Dialogue of 2022. The 2022 Council and Executive Committee were introduced. Pastor Hoffman reviewed the congregational goals that church leaders developed last year.

Goal 1: The BLC community is engaged in the ministry of the congregation.

Goal 2: The BLC community builds intergenerational relationships and connection.

We discussed how nationwide change in religious trends and landscape are changing more rapidly than ever before. With that in mind, leadership will continue to focus on these goals throughout the year. The finances during the first quarter of our fiscal year are tracking very close to the approved budget. The "Sharing our Blessings Team" was formed at last year's Annual

Meeting to gift \$30,000 from BLC's operating account to local ministries. They've established criteria for how they plan to disburse the funds and will soon be soliciting input for potential recipients. We are blessed to be members of the BLC congregation!

**Sharing Our Blessings:** You may remember at the BLC annual meeting in October 2021 a resolution was approved which authorized \$30,000 in special mission funding in fiscal year 2022. This article is part of an effort to keep the Congregation informed about work being done in response to the resolution and what will be asked of you.

After the annual meeting, Council created an ad-hoc committee, which became the "Sharing Our Blessings" Committee, consisting of Pr. Amy, Alli O'Malley, Lisa Rosenbauer, Julie Owen, Cathy Gottermeier and Alan Sleeman. Council has asked the committee to develop criteria for how this money can best be used to further the mission of the church. So far, the Committee has developed the criteria, below is a condensed version.

- 1. Share with Synod and Churchwide
- 2. Make all spending within the greater Rochester metropolitan area.
- 3. Gather input from the Congregation.
- 4. Recipients will promote Congregational engagement, and
- 5. Recipients will make a report to the Congregation demonstrating the impact.

We are now at the point of gathering your input. To do so we are asking you to complete a short survey. The survey can be found at <a href="https://forms.gle/t3N6aKb5zEdi8CjB9">https://forms.gle/t3N6aKb5zEdi8CjB9</a>. If you would rather give your input in person members of the committee will be at a table in the Narthex on Sunday 2/6 and 2/13 and happy to talk to you. After we gather Congregational input the committee will make a recommendation to Council, which we will share with everyone. Thanks for your help.
