

#### 100th Anniversary Reflection by Shiellee Weidner

I have been studying the Bible regularly for about 40 years and have discovered that it really does hold all of the answers to how to live a happy life. For instance, I had spent the early years of my life worrying about things that might happen, but often never DID come to pass. I think that worry is a coping mechanism that I had developed as a child, thinking that if I worried I could somehow protect myself from being forced to deal with a negative situation. As a result of studying God's word, gradually I've learned that worry does not come from God!

Actually, the Bible says that we are to live only in today, that we can't change yesterday because yesterday is gone. Only God knows what tomorrow will bring so we must keep our minds centered on today. Little by little I began to realize that when a problem comes along, the best thing to do is to turn it over to God in prayer!

In the beginning I found that praying like this would give me some relief, but worrying had become such a habit that the negative thoughts would pop right back into my mind over and over again.

God and I spent many years tossing worry back and forth until I learned in a *new way* to really trust our wonderful Lord! I finally learned that God would keep the worry and would only give it back to me with my permission.

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4: 6-7




This Sunday, we welcome Sarah Hawbecker as our guest organist. While earning her Master of Music in Organ Performance at Eastman School of Music, Sarah served as Bethlehem's Organist and Choir Director from 1988-1990. Following worship, there will be an informal gathering in the sanctuary when folks can talk with Sarah and hear more about her background, including her specialty, working with children's choirs. In addition, we will show a taped message from Rev. Paul Adler (son of Rev. Dallas Adler, 1958-1966, and a former BLC member). Rev. Adler was a scheduled guest pastor for this Sunday, but is unable to attend due to illness. His message will also be live streamed.

On Friday, April 1 at 7 pm, you are invited to a showing of the 1998 (Act 1) and 2003 (Act 2) BLC productions of Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat in the Sanctuary. Dr. Johnson is the Director of Choral Activities at Eastern Michigan University, Ypsilanti, MI and the artistic director and conductor of the Detroit Concert Choir.

February Council Highlights - The BLC Council met on February 17. Actions and discussions included the following:

- Voted to approve Bylaws guiding the Investment in Ministries Fund. The congregation will have the opportunity to vote on these Bylaws at a specially-called congregational meeting on May 15.
- The BLC Scholarship Fund has only enough funds to provide awards for 2-3 more rounds of scholarship distribution. The Council has decided not to accept additional contributions to this fund. It will close when current dollars are distributed. Council remains committed to supporting the youth of this congregation in mission and ministry through other avenues.
- With 4 months of the fiscal year complete, giving and expenses are both tracking very close to plan. This is particularly good news as these first 4 months constitute 40% of our annual receipts.

#### Upcoming Vote on the Investment in Ministries Fund

At our Annual Meeting on October 31, 2021 the congregation of Bethlehem Lutheran Church approved the Resolution to establish the Investment in Ministries Fund (IMF), an endowment fund designed to expand the ministries supported by BLC. At their February meeting, BLC's Council voted to approve the Bylaws guiding the Investment in Ministries Fund. The congregation will be asked to approve these Bylaws to formally establish this Fund at a specially called congregational meeting which is scheduled for May 15.

Over the next several weeks we will be sharing additional information about the Investment in Ministries Fund in the STAR to give you the information you need to make an informed decision to adopt the Bylaws.
