Less Grumbling, More Humbling

Grumbling! The crowd around Jesus—the "in" crowd, that is—was grumbling. Grumbling because Jesus welcomed those who traditionally had been set apart: tax collectors and sinners. Who are those who cause us to grumble? Whose seemingly undeserved handout or unearned status change filled our hearts with resentment this week? Jesus speaks to us today because we too often see life as a game with winners and losers, points and playbooks, offense and defense. Can we open our hearts and minds to hear today's humbling good news? God's love is freely shared with all: we cannot earn it, we cannot deserve it. When we attend worship, we do so out of thanksgiving and praise for God's glory, hunger and thirst for God's word and sacrament. We do not attend worship to achieve some status within God's kingdom. When we help a neighbor, share with a stranger, assist the afflicted, or acknowledge the overlooked we do so because Christ first did the same for us. We respond to God's grace and mercy with our own feeble attempts to emulate God's perfect love. It is challenging, exhausting, never-ending, perspective-altering, radically humbling work. It's work that is impossible to do without the inspiration of Christ, the nourishment of wine and bread, and the strength of the saints who have gone before us and with whom we walk Christ's path today. Let us find those in our world who teach us about Christ's unending reconciliation, so that we can all celebrate and rejoice as the family of God.

Lutheran Organization 101 - Is the word Synod new to you? Our Synod is one geographical district of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The Upstate NY Synod contains 170 individual congregations. The English word synod comes from two Greek words syn + hodos that mean "common road." A synod is the people of the congregations and other ministries traveling the way of faith together. Within our national ELCA church:

- Congregations group together to become Conferences
 There are 7 Conferences in the Upstate NY Synod. We are part of the Genesee Finger Lakes Conference. We have a conference dean; Rev Jonathan Deibler who is also the pastor at St. John's, Victor. Here is a map of the ELCA Conferences in NY Conferences and Deans Upstate New York Synod | Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (upstatenysynod.org)
- Conferences group together to become **Synods**We are in the Upstate NY Synod under the leadership of Bishop Lee Miller, II.
- 65 Synods in the US form the national **ELCA** based in Chicago. Our national presiding bishop is Rev. Elizabeth Eaton. You can read about her at <u>Presiding Bishop - Evangelical</u> Lutheran Church in America (elca.org)

The ELCA is one of many Lutheran denominations – but that discussion is for another day!



- ★ March Council Highlights The BLC Council met on March 17. Highlights from this month are
 - A Special Congregational Meeting will be held 5/15/22 to approve the IMF Bylaws.
 - Work was done on the organ by builder David Moore.
 - The issue with the building's heat after the weekend of 3/13 was addressed and fixed.

★ The IMF Team: At our upcoming Special Congregational Meeting on May 15th, you will be asked to approve the IMF Bylaws to formally establish the Investment in Ministries Fund for BLC. We want you to have all the information you need to make an informed decision. The Investment in Ministries Fund (IMF) is administered by the IMF Team, an ad hoc committee of the Finance Committee, composed of 6 appointed members of the congregation (Paulette Costanza, Roger Kolker, Neil Vokes, Mark Gaul, John Panko, and John Costanza) and 1 additional member from the Finance Committee (Andy Gates). Since July, 2019 the Investment in Ministries team has been working with the Finance Committee, Missions and Social Concerns Committee and Council to determine the purpose and direction of the fund and to meet all regulatory requirements for establishing an endowment fund for BLC.

The Investment in Ministries Fund will be invested to generate reasonable growth while carefully safeguarding the principal. Gifts made to the fund will be managed with care and prudence. The principal of each gift – the original gift or bequest – will remain intact and will be invested to produce income. Endowment gifts can support new ministries or provide additional support for existing ministries. Awards from the fund (I.e., fund disbursements) will be recommended by the Missions & Social Concerns Committee and approved by Council. The Investment in Ministries Fund will be used to support development and expansion of the ministries beyond our walls that are not part of BLC's Annual Operating Budget.
