The Day, the Day

What is Easter anyway? Christians consider Easter to be the "first day." From Easter comes the practice of worshiping on Sunday morning. It is the first day of the week. It is also the first day of new creation, sometimes called the "eighth day" of the week, for on it Christ restored the image of God in the human and in so doing also brought restoration and renewal to all of creation. The Easter season proceeds from and celebrates this first day. In the resurrected Christ, there is time after the end, life after death, restoration of what was broken, the brightening of what had gone dark. In the fifty days of Easter, Christian communities around the world strive to worship God in a way that illustrates that the body of Christ lives now in the heavenly places and also in the gathered body in the world. Worship is where heaven and earth meet.

100 YEARS Just a reminder that our April 24 anniversary guest, Rev. Theodore Schulz, is unable to join us due to Covid concerns. He is the grandson of our first pastor, Rev. Henry D. Schulz, and his wife, Minnie, our first organist and choir director. Pastor Schulz wrote: "I was honored to receive the invite and very much wanted to be with you and the congregation in order to represent the Pastor Henry D. and Minnie Schulz family. This was the most difficult decision and was not made lightly." A number of family members were planning to attend with him.

Our 100th Anniversary Prism Concert, an exceptional evening of music, is planned for Friday, April 29 at 7 pm in the sanctuary. Each individual or group will perform a musical piece without interruption, one after another, from a different location in the sanctuary. Applause is reserved until the end. This is a wonderful opportunity to invite a neighbor or friend to Bethlehem for a delightful evening of music.

Looking ahead, on May 1, we will welcome guest clergy Rev. Richard Hembrock to lead us in worship. A new name to most of us, Pastor Hembrock is a 'son of Bethlehem.' ★ Special Congregational Meeting - Bethlehem will hold a Special Congregational Meeting on Sunday, May 15 at 10:15 am (following worship) for the purpose of approving changes to the Bylaws allowing for the creation of an Investment in Ministry Fund (IMF). This meeting will be held in person and only those present may vote. According to Bethlehem's Constitution, changes to the Bylaws require a two-thirds vote of those voting members present and voting. Copies of the proposed Bylaws are available by contacting the church office. To learn more about these proposed Bylaws, plan to attend one of the upcoming informational sessions hosted by the IMF Team (below).

The BLC Investment in Ministries Team will be hosting four Q&A Sessions to prepare for the upcoming Special Congregational meeting on Sunday, **May 15** when the congregation will vote on adopting Bylaws to formally establish the Investment in Ministries Fund for BLC. What is Socially Responsible Investing and Why Does It Matter?

Socially responsible investing is an investing strategy that aims to generate both social change and financial returns for an investor. Socially responsible investments can include companies making a positive sustainable or social impact, such as a solar energy company, and exclude those making a negative impact.

The Corporate Social Responsibility program of the ELCA seeks to enter into dialogue with business representatives on the social implications of company practices and to affect ELCA investment policy in socially responsible ways. The ELCA calls its people and institutions to encourage corporations to act in socially responsible ways and to invest in alignment with ELCA priorities.

Social purpose funds are able to screen out companies whose business practices conflict with these ELCA social criteria. The ELCA Ministry Growth Fund screens out companies associated with alcohol, tobacco, gambling, military weapons, pornography, private prisons, environment, and political and civil human rights.

If the Bylaws are approved by the congregation at the special congregational meeting on May 15th, we will invest the IMF funds into the ELCA's Ministry Growth Fund because of its focus to invest in companies creating positive impact and to screen out companies creating negative impact in our society. BLC's Re-Opening Team met on March 31 and revised Bethlehem's COVID protocols. The following changes are effective immediately. The Re-Opening Committee will next meet on Tuesday, April 26, 2022 to determine what next steps, if any, will be taken.

WORSHIP and SINGING – We will continue to provide opportunities to livestream worship whenever possible and we encourage anyone who is sick or experiencing COVID-related symptoms to share in worship through livestream.

Masks are required when gathered for worship.

• Worship leaders may remove their masks when in a leadership role (ex. speaking, praying, chanting).

ALL OTHER CHURCH ACTIVITIES – We trust individuals to gauge their own comfort with risks and will post information about CDC mask guidance. As a result of this change all non-worship and non-singing activities at BLC will be mask-optional. We continue to practice love and care of our neighbors by honoring one another in making choices to wear masks or not. We have obtained KN-95 masks to share with people who wish to continue to remain masked while participating in activities at BLC.

- In-person, indoor fellowship activities may resume in designated areas (eg, on Sunday mornings, coffee hour can resume in the Fellowship Hall; a small group may agree to share snacks while meeting in the adult ed room).
- All food and beverages must remain in the designated space and not be brought into other rooms.
- All Faith Formation activities are mask optional.

- ★ Are you, or people you know, going hungry? If you are in need of emergency food supplies and live in the 14450 zip code, dial 585-425-7410. A volunteer will call you back within 24 hours during weekdays between 9AM and 5PM. The volunteer will ask several general questions concerning your family size, your income and, of course, your name and home address. If you qualify for emergency food supplies, a week's supply of food (based on your household's size) will be packaged and scheduled for you to pick up at the food shelf in Fairport. Directions and times will be provided. If you do not live in the 14450 zip code, dial 211 or 1-877-356-9211. They will provide you with information on an emergency food provider near you. They will ask you for your zip code to identify organizations serving your neighborhood and/or region.
