

Sharing God's Love - 100th Anniversary Reflection by Sherry Cook

Sharing means giving a portion of what we have to someone else. It is an action word requiring both relationship and engagement. Bethlehem has lived into this in many ways through the years. As we researched in preparation for our anniversary, we documented how BLC has impacted our community and beyond over the years. Thirty years ago, Dan Juers and Lisa Rosenbauer were the driving force in establishing Advent House. The power of the Spirit is evident today when we reflect on the numbers: more than 530 terminally ill people have called Advent House home, 150 hands-on volunteers have provided over 13,000 hours of loving, compassionate care to the residents, and volunteers in all areas have willingly donated over 500,000 hours of assistance. We have also supported Grace House, Resolve, Perinton Ecumenical Ministries and other organizations in Fairport and greater Rochester community.

We have shared God's love in the wider world as well. A partial list includes: 217 Baskets of Promise assembled and donated to Lutheran World Relief; 913 hand-knitted winter hats sent to The Seafarers International House; 1200 quilts donated to The Linus Project; over 250 Prayer Shawls given to those in need of a reminder that they are held in prayer by their BLC family; 120 meals each month prepared at BLC and distributed to those in need; 38 e-readers sent to pastors in Zambia; 118 dresses given to Dress-a-Girl Around the World. Nine BLC members offered 250 hours of labor in Puerto Rico supported by \$3515 in donations from their BLC family to help with disaster relief. In addition, we sponsored a refugee family from Laos, and financially supported a medical student from Cameroon, who went on to work for Doctors Without Borders. These numbers are truly a testament to the power of the Holy Spirit working within and among us!

Pastor Julie Bergdahl reminded us that the Spirit ignites us to serve and share God's love in the world. She introduced us to Ms. Pew Potato who uses each part of her body to share God's love — arms to help, eyes to see, ears to listen, legs to go to those places where there is need. The Spirit calls us to put arms and legs to our faith, to freely share God's abundant love in our daily life through words and actions. May we continue to heed that call into our next 100 years!

This column will occasionally feature reflections or devotions from members of the congregation (as it does this week!) as one way that we practice discipleship and share ministry together. If you would like to contribute in the future, please contact one of the pastors.



Last Sunday, it was our pleasure to welcome Rev. Julie Bergdahl, our first female Associate Pastor (1991-1994), back to the pulpit. Bethlehem was her first call. Pastor Bergdahl, or "PB" as she is affectionately called, thanked us for the many gifts and opportunities to learn that she experienced first-hand at Bethlehem. She reminded us that the Holy Spirit activates the good in all of us and will continue to guide us forward as it has in the past 100 years.

In her taped message, Dr. Kathy Elwood (Director of Chancel Choir and Bell Choirs 1992-2003) shared that it was good to be back with us in spirit. Under her leadership, Bethlehem's music ministry grew by leaps and bounds, both within and outside our walls. Thanks be to God for our singers and musicians who continue to lead us in praise and worship.

- **★ Re-Opening Team Update:** After thoughtful consideration, the re-opening team recommends that we move to a mask optional status at BLC, including during worship, effective June 26th. We are learning to live alongside the COVID-19 virus. As a church community, our continued obligation is to care for one another; particularly the most vulnerable among us. While we recognize there is no single action that will eliminate transmission, we continue to prioritize reducing risk (and therefore caring for our neighbor) in the following ways:
 - self-monitoring and staying home if we are experiencing symptoms
 - continuing livestream worship and virtual options for church events
 - making KN95 or surgical masks available to all who enter our worship space
 - utilizing our upgraded air exchange in the sanctuary
 - continuing with our current practices for communion
 - practicing social distancing as much as possible
 - · consistently washing and sanitizing our hands

We will adjust our practices if or when needed, including requiring masks again if the situation warrants.

The re-opening team will continue to meet regularly to evaluate our practices and adjust expectations as needed. We are grateful for a congregation that continually cares for one another, particularly those that are most vulnerable. ★ Stand for the Victims of Gun Violence - Silent Prayer Vigil - organized by St. Luke's Episcopal Church.

Details: Saturday, June 18 from 10 - 11 am, gathering near the Gazebo for the Fairport Library at 9:45 am. Bring a lawn chair if standing for an hour will be a challenge. You are also invited to bring signs that oppose gun violence. This will be a silent vigil. Silent vigils will also be held on Tuesday, June 21 at 5 pm and Thursday, June 30 at 5 pm.

7 pm, Monday June 27 in Assumption's Living Room: Rochester - A Tale of Two Cities and Biblical Social Teaching with Deacon David Palma Pope Francis tells us that it is important to listen to the voices of those on the margins. On June 27 we will listen to some of those voices in a couple of short documentary films made here in Rochester to help us better understand the issues faced by people who struggle in the "other" City of Rochester, especially the homeless. After the films we will discuss the issues raised. We ask ourselves - how are the most vulnerable people doing in our locale? In a society marred by deepening divisions, it is helpful to look at our social teaching to gain perspective as we deal with the complex problems we face. Our facilitator will be Deacon David Palma who serves in the Southeast Rochester Catholic Community (Blessed Sacrament, St. Boniface, and St. Mary's.) These communities have a rich history of direct service to those on the margins. Over the years David has worked with the homeless on the streets as well as with migrant farm workers. He is a founding board member of *Person-Centered Housing Options*, a non-profit agency in Rochester that is dedicated to moving people from homelessness to sustainability.
