

⁶"I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. Music Matters

In his book *My Grandmother's Hands: Racialized Trauma and the Pathways to Mending Our Hearts and Bodies*, Resmaa Menakem offers several activities that help "harmonize your body with other bodies" (Las Vegas, NV: Central Recovery Press, 2017, p. 182). One activity in the book that might work among a community that loves to sing together is humming. . . . This activity is a way to relax the bodies present, allowing for a sense of harmony among the people. It could be an activity to practice the oneness Jesus prayed for in the upper room. And it's a tangible way to hear the connectedness Jesus embodied with his first followers and shared in his prayers for them.
