JESUS SOUGHT ME

A reading from Luke.

¹Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, ²he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. ³He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. ⁴When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." ⁵Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." ⁶When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. ⁷So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. ⁸But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" ⁹For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; ¹⁰and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." ¹¹When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him. The word of the Lord.

- When Peter and Jesus first meet, they catch an abundance of fish. What in your life feels abundantly good?
- Jesus sends the disciples into "deep water. What does that image bring to mind? Does deep water feel risky, holy, challenging, or awe-inspiriting?
- What is the beginning of your faith story?
- Peter doubted that he was worthy of Jesus' present. What helps you remember and hold onto your self-worth?
- Jesus calls Peter to be a "fisher of people." What might God be calling you to be in this season of life?
