INTO THE WATERS

Matthew 14:22-33

A reading from Matthew.

²²Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. ²³And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, ²⁴but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them. ²⁵And early in the morning he came walking toward them on the sea. ²⁶But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out in fear. ²⁷But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid."

²⁸Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." ²⁹He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came toward Jesus. ³⁰But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" ³¹Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?" ³²When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. ³³And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

SILENCE FOR REFLECTION

A bell will mark the beginning and end of this time of silence. During this time, you are invited to ponder using the poetry and art inspired by this gospel reading that are included on your insert or focus on one of the following questions. Where does your wandering heart take you?

- What truths or wounds weigh heavily on you today? What things cause you to sink?
- When the storms in your life rage, what do you do? How do you pray? Where do you go?
- Peter gets out of the boat and walks toward Jesus. When in your life have you intentionally moved closer to Jesus? What prompted that?

- Who in our world needs rescuing right now?
- When Peter begins to sin, Jesus reaches for him immediately. What does this tell you about God? About Jesus? About the storms of our life?
- Jesus tells Peter, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." Where in your life do you need courage?
- When Peter sings, Jesus asks, "Why did you doubt?" Do you think Peter doubted himself or Christ? How does doubt show up in your life?
