The first chapter of John's gospel owes much to the biblical tradition that imagined Wisdom as existing before anything was created and having a role in the work of creation. Christ, the wisdom of God (1 Cor. 1:24), today invites us to eat his flesh and drink his blood. John's gospel includes no account of the institution of the Lord's supper, but here we can't help hearing Jesus' words as an invitation to the meal of bread and wine we share.





PRAYER OF THE DAY



HEARING GOD'S WORD

READING: Proverbs 9:1-6

Christians have seen in the Woman Wisdom poems a metaphor for Christ, who serves up a meal of bread and wine and calls us all to live in the way of insight.
¹Wisdom has built her house, she has hewn her seven pillars.
²She has slaughtered her animals, she has mixed her wine, she has also set her table.
³She has sent out her servant-girls, she calls from the highest places in the town,
⁴"You that are simple, turn in here!" To those without sense she says,
⁵"Come, eat of my bread and drink of the wine I have mixed.
⁶Lay aside immaturity, and live, and walk in the way of insight."

The holy gospel according to John. Glory to you, O Lord.

GOSPEL: John 6:51-58

This Sunday's passage from John 6 is illumined by the readings from Proverbs and Ephesians. The stark vocabulary of the gospel can go down well when at the table we eat a piece of good bread and drink a swallow of fine wine.

³⁵Jesus said to [the crowd,] "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

Jesus said,] ⁵¹"I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

⁵²The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" ⁵³So Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. ⁵⁴Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; ⁵⁵for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. ⁵⁶Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. ⁵⁷Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. ⁵⁸This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever." The gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**



WORDS OF INSTITUTION


God, you open wide your hands and feed all creation with your goodness. Open us to receive all that you give us – your mercy, your grace, your love, your very self. Amen

Our communion bread is gluten-free, unless noted by the pastor. Grape juice is available; indicate your need to the communion assistant.



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You're Invited

Today Jesus invites us to a meal. It is an extraordinary invitation to do an ordinary thing: form bonds of love and community through shared food and drink. Like Wisdom inviting us to the feast of insight (Prov. 9:1-6), Jesus' invitation to share in the meal of his body and blood teaches us about the breadth and depth of God's love and about God's desire for us to abide in that love (John 6:56).

Jesus' audience asks a reasonable question: "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" (John 6:52). Jesus' answer doesn't really address the question; instead, he reiterates that he is the true bread from heaven, the true source of eternal life. This must have been off-putting to his listeners. Eat flesh? Drink blood? And yet, here we find a profoundly grace-filled invitation abide in me—and a promise: through this meal I abide in you. We are invited to not only join Jesus at the table, but to be at home in the love of God, knowing that Christ makes his home in our hearts and lives too. So come: eat, and get to know God.
